MULTI-FAITH COMMITTEE TO STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY UNITY



Colchester City Council is pleased to announce the formation of a new Multi-Faith Committee, an initiative designed to bring together leaders from across the city's many faith communities to promote inclusion, mutual understanding, and shared support.

The announcement coincides with Interfaith Week 2025, a national celebration of dialogue and cooperation between different faiths. The Council is facilitating the initial coordination of the committee, but it will be shaped and led by faith representatives themselves. The committee will provide a space for faith leaders to meet regularly, share perspectives and work together to support the wellbeing of Colchester's diverse communities.

The idea for the committee was developed following a historic Council meeting in October, where representatives from Jewish, Muslim and Christian communities came together to offer prayers in remembrance of victims of the recent Manchester tragedy. It was the first time a multi-faith reflection had opened a Council session in Colchester, and it marked a significant moment of unity and shared purpose.

The Multi-Faith Committee will meet quarterly, with additional meetings convened if needed in response to specific events. One of its key roles will be to coordinate a joint response from faith leaders during times of difficulty or tension, including issuing public statements of support and solidarity. The committee will also work closely with Essex Police, who will be invited to join the group to help inform its discussions and strengthen collaboration.

In addition to its role in crisis response, the committee will encourage respectful conversations between different faiths, helping to foster deeper understanding and build stronger relationships across communities. It will support wider efforts to promote community cohesion and will play a central role in

organising events and initiatives that celebrate the cultural and spiritual richness of Colchester.

Councillor David King, Leader of Colchester City Council, said: "Colchester is a city of many faiths, and this committee will help us build stronger connections between communities. We are proud to support this initiative, which will be led by faith leaders and shaped by their shared values and vision. It will ensure that, when challenges arise, we respond together with compassion, clarity and unity."

Councillor Michael Lilley, Mayor of Colchester, added: "The multi-faith prayers at our recent Council meeting were a powerful reminder of the values we share. This committee will help us continue that journey, creating a space for dialogue, reflection and collective action."

Chairman of Colchester Mosque, Mohammed Mozir Uddin, shared his support for the initiative: "This Multi-Faith Committee is a welcome and timely step towards strengthening the bonds between our communities. As Muslims, we value peace, dialogue and mutual respect, and we are proud to stand alongside other faiths in building a more united and compassionate Colchester."

Ruth Stone, Lay Reader, Colchester and District Jewish Community, added: "We welcome this new initiative and look forward to working alongside our fellow faith leaders as we go forward together."

Colchester City Council is now inviting faith-based organisations and community leaders to register their interest in joining the Multi-Faith Committee. Expressions of interest can be submitted via email to cabinetofficer@colchester.gov.uk.

This Interfaith Week, Colchester reaffirms its commitment to inclusion, dialogue, and community spirit, and welcomes all faiths to be part of this important new chapter.



COLCHESTER SKYLINE SPARKLES WITH ST NICHOLAS SQUARE 25M CHRISTMAS WHEEL

After a summer of success and praise from local businesses, Colchester's new St Nicholas Square is once again at the heart of celebrations. This time for Christmas.

The £1.6million space – which opened in July - will host a spectacular 25-metre Observation Wheel, giving residents and visitors a unique chance to see the city from the rooftops and enjoy views of Colchester's festive lights.

Organised by Colchester Events with support from local businesses, the wheel made its debut during the Christmas Light Switch-On weekend on Saturday in November, adding an extra sparkle to the celebrations. It will return from Tuesday 2nd December, running daily from 11.00am to 8.00pm, and will stay in place for most of December.

Tickets are available at the booth on the day: £5.00 for adults, £4.00 for children, or £15.00 for a family.

Cllr David King, Leader of Colchester City Council, said: "We knew our new St Nicholas Square could be used creatively, for music, and gatherings across the year, and this Christmas Wheel is the perfect example."

Alongside the Observation Wheel, the Christmas Light Switch-On will feature live music, street entertainment, and festive markets across the city centre, creating a magical atmosphere for families and visitors.

The Observation Wheel is a fantastic addition that will make this year's celebrations even more special."

FLY-TIPPING CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED AFTER 1.65 TONNES CLEARED FROM A12

Colchester City Council cleared 1.65 tonnes of waste from the A12 over three nights, beginning 27 October. The council made use of overnight road closures, enabling them to safely work at the roadside to collect a large amount of fly-tipped waste and littering.

Street Care and Safety operatives began with lay-bys that the council are responsible for, moving onto the four-mile stretch of A12 between Junction 28 and 26, London bound, for the remaining two nights. The fly-tipped waste consisted of old tyres, plastic bottles, paper and cardboard and old signage, adding up to the same weight as a large family car!

This effort complements Keep Britain Tidy's "Fight Fly-Tipping Fortnight" — a new campaign aiming to crack down on rogue, unlicensed, operators and help locals protect themselves and their community from fly tipping crimes.

Fly-tipping costs councils across England millions of pounds every year in clean-up costs, draining money that could otherwise be spent on essential local services. In Colchester, the council cleared up a total of 4,332 incidents in the past year, costing the council, and therefore local taxpayers, over £85,000.

The campaign asks residents to do

their best to protect themselves and their communities from criminal waste operators. It aims to shine a spotlight on criminal operators, who lure people in with cheap deals, only to illegally dump household waste on streets, fields and public spaces. Households can take a few steps to ensure their waste is disposed of properly: ask for a waste carrier registration number, check it on the Environment Agency's public

register here (or call 0300 065 3000) and check you'll get a receipt.

Cllr Martin Goss, Portfolio Holder for Waste, Neighbourhoods and Leisure, said: "Fly-tipping has an impact on all of us and is a deep source of frustration. Not only is it a blight on our local environment, it costs taxpayers thousands in clear up costs. This is money that could be spent on other important services.

"Our teams work hard to tackle fly-tipping and littering, and they do a fantastic job, but we need our community's help to stop it at the source. We're asking people to check who they pay to take rubbish away. If a deal looks too good to be true, it probably is, and sadly it's our residents and communities who ultimately pay the price."

Fight Fly-tipping Fortnight will run from 10-23 November 2025, with local authorities across the country joining forces with Keep Britain Tidy to highlight the scale and impact of fly-tipping, educate residents on how to protect themselves and their communities.

Residents are also welcome to join local litter picking events with Colchester's Litter Warriors - a council-supported initiative that enables residents to help maintain a clean and green city by litter picking in their local areas. More than 600 Litter Warriors are already making a difference, and anyone interested in joining can register by emailing community.volunteers@colchester.gov.uk. Volunteers receive a litter picking kit and guidance on how to get involved.

MEN WALKING IN CAPE TOWN & LONDON

We studied the walking habits of young men in Cape Town and London – and debunked a myth.

Being mobile means people can get access to opportunities and take part in economic and social life. Mobility, in all its forms, is critical for cities to thrive.

Recent studies highlight what most African city dwellers already know: walking is the main way of getting around, and essential for daily life. This is true for people who live in low-income neighbourhoods across the world. When people lack money for taxi, bus or train fares, walking becomes the only option even if the distances are great.

Yet, most African cities and many low-income neighbourhoods globally lack spaces for walking that are safe and appropriate.

While researchers place a lot of emphasis on road traffic, public transport and infrastructure, little attention has been paid to the importance of walking as a daily mobility strategy for low-income communities.

Even less is known about the walking experiences of young men. There often seems to be an assumption they are free to travel wherever and whenever they choose, that they're invulnerable. But what are the realities they face on the street, and what we can learn from them?

We're a team of human geographers and anthropologists working in collaboration with an international non-governmental organisation and a group of 12 peer researchers who are walkers: six from Cape Town and six from London. Our study aimed to learn more about the experiences of men like this, aged 18-35, in low-income urban neighbourhoods in South Africa and the UK.

We wanted to better understand issues of access and opportunity for communities that rely on walking. We also wanted to explore the potential of community-based research for improving lives.



South Africa's townships were built as black residential areas under apartheid

mobility diaries. Each of them also interviewed at least 10 other young men in their community.

Although their specific neighbourhoods aren't named for ethical reasons, the study areas were two township neighbourhoods in Cape Town and various boroughs in the east end of London. They were strikingly similar when it came to a sense of everyday dangers from high rates of crime, violence and deprivation.

The study

Our focus on young men was influenced by findings from an earlier study of young women in Cape Town. That study emphasised the particular concerns women have for the safety of their male counterparts who had to walk back home after accompanying the women to transit points.

We not only set out to foreground the walking experiences of young men; we also wanted to do research differently and with maximum potential impact for those involved. Peer research provides living knowledge, and also a chance to make meaningful change in transforming policy and practice. Peer researchers are, after all, experts in their own lives.

Through a five-day workshop we trained peer researchers in research methods, ethics and data collection. We gained an understanding of their communities through shared mapping exercises. The young men then set out to collect data independently, using

the weather, darkness and the presence of criminal gangs.

As one participant put it:

I walk in the afternoon to the bus (to get to a job in a distant neighbourhood). It takes 10 minutes. It's not safe ... If I see criminals I pretend I'm tying my shoelace.

Other peer researchers confirmed that even the simple act of appearing to tie a shoelace allows you to survey the street while not looking scared and protecting masculine dignity. If it looks dangerous, they said, you can pretend you've forgotten something and run back the way you've come.

Our findings illustrate the complexity of daily walks. While mediating danger on the streets and navigating the precarities of urban life, our peer researchers also reflected on the pleasures of walking. They sometimes found joy and relief in walking:

I get to breathe fresh air instead of just sitting in the house ... thinking about being unemployed and stuff. I get to see people and be healed.

Encountering the city on foot has benefits for physical and mental health.

Why this matters

Safe, reliable mobility is essential for lives and livelihoods in the city. Our study identified ways that community stakeholders can support safe walking and therefore help with access to economic and social opportunities.

Lifting the veil on men's vulnerabilities allows community members and policy makers to understand the challenges across the gender spectrum.

But our research also matters because of how we went about it. The potential for change comes in the form of ongoing stakeholder engagement. Findings from the research were presented by the peer researchers themselves to community stakeholders and local government officials, people who have the capacity to improve infrastructure and safety.

TEN YEARS AT BLACKWATER VETS

For ten years at Blackwater Vets, I have learned a simple but profound truth: a community is not built by the pursuit of recognition, but by the quiet, steady commitment to make life a little better for beings who cannot speak for themselves. MERSEA Lights Up

THE TRUTH ABOUT VIKINGS & MEAD MIGHT DISAPPOINT MODERN ENTHUSIASTS

A group of friends sit around a table sharing stories and sipping mead. The men sport beards and the women sip from drinking horns – but these aren't Vikings, they're modern-day hipsters.

The 21st century has seen a revival of mead, a fermented alcoholic drink made from water and honey. In the past 20 years or so, hundreds of new meaderies have sprung up around the world.

These meaderies often draw on Viking imagery in their branding. Their wares are called things like Odin's Mead or Viking Blod and their logos include longships, axes, ravens and drinking horns. A few even have their own themed Viking drinking halls. This is part of what might be called the "Viking turn", the renewed pop culture vogue for the Vikings in the past 20 years, which has made them the stars of a rash of films, TV shows, video games and memes.


Since the rowdy banquet scene in the 1958 film *The Vikings*, wild, boozy feasting has been a staple of the hyper-

so, for good or ill, they have tended to be conflated.

Most of Beowulf's action plays out around mead-halls – the power centres of lords such as the Danish king Hrothgar, where the leader would entertain his followers with feasts and drinking in return for their support and military service.

This relationship, based upon the consumption of food and drink, but inextricably bound up with honour and loyalty, is the basis of the heroic warrior society that is celebrated by the poet. Not surprisingly, therefore, episodes in which mead is drunk are frequent and clearly emotionally loaded.


A second high-profile appearance of mead comes in Norse mythology. At the god Odin's great hall, Valhöll, the Einherjar – the most heroic and honoured warriors slain in battle – feast and drink. They consume the unending mead that flows from the udders of a goat named Heiðrún who lives on the roof. Norse myth, it should be noted, is sometimes quite odd.



English medu, (mead), and compound words derived from it appear far more frequently in strongly emotive and poetic contexts such as Beowulf than in practical ones such as laws or charters.

This contrasts strongly with the pattern of usage of other words for alcohol such as ealu (ale), beor (beer) intuitively probably "cider" or win (wine), which are far more frequently used in a functional and practical way. This led Fell to believe that the concentration on mead in the likes of Beowulf was a "nostalgic fiction". Mead, she concluded, was a fundamental part of an idealised and backwards-looking imagined heroic world rather than something customarily drunk in the course of everyday life.

So what, then, for modern mead-drinking Viking enthusiasts? The point is not, of course, that Vikings or any other early medieval people never drank mead – some clearly did, if not perhaps quite so often as is sometimes alleged – but rather that it served more as a symbol of a story-filled heroic neverland. But that is arguably exactly how many of today's mead-drinkers also use it.

masculine pop culture Viking. This theme continues in the 21st century, from the History Channel's *Vikings* TV series (2013–present) to games like *Skyrim* (2011) and *Assassin's Creed: Valhalla* (2020).

But while modern media suggest that Vikings drank mead as often as water, history tells a slightly different story.

Three stories are foundational for the Viking association with mead. The first is the Anglo-Saxon poem *Beowulf*, which survives in a single manuscript written in Old English and now in the British Library.


The story it tells is set in southern Sweden and Denmark in the early 6th century, so the warrior culture and lifestyle that *Beowulf* idealises are actually of a period considerably earlier than the Viking age (usually dated from the later 8th century onward). It does share a great deal of its substance with later Viking notions of the good life and

Lastly, another important myth tells of Odin's theft of the "mead of poetry". This substance was created by two dwarves from honey and the blood of a being named Kvasir, whom they had murdered. The mead bestows gifts of wisdom and poetic skill upon those who drink it.

The whole myth is long and complicated, but it culminates with Odin swallowing the mead, and escaping in the form of an eagle, only to excrete some of it backwards when he is especially hotly pursued.

These are striking and impressive episodes that clearly demonstrate the symbolic and cultural significance of mead in mythology and stories about heroes of the Viking age. But that is far from proof that it was actually consumed on a significant scale in England or Scandinavia.

As far back as the 1970s, the philologist Christine Fell noted that Old

Colchester City Council is preparing to consult on its Preferred Options Local Plan, which will shape development across our city and surrounding communities until 2041. This is a pivotal moment for West Mersea and we urge residents to engage fully.


The draft plan proposes an additional 300 homes on a new site at Dawes Lane, in addition to the 200+ homes already allocated in the previous Local Plan. This would bring the total to over 500 new dwellings in a town with unique geographical and environmental constraints.

We are not opposed to limited development that meets genuine local need, but we believe this scale of expansion is not sustainable without clear and enforceable infrastructure commitments.

Key Concerns

We have raised strong objections to the proposed allocation, based on the following:


■ Island geography and tidal flooding:





BUBBLE TEA'S HAS A DARK SIDE FROM LEAD CONTAMINATION TO KIDNEY STONES

They've become as ubiquitous on British high streets as coffee shops – bubble tea outlets offering their Instagram-worthy drinks in countless flavour combinations. The Taiwanese beverage, a blend of black tea, milk, sugar and chewy tapioca pearls, has gained global popularity since its origins in the 1980s. But recent findings suggest this trendy drink may warrant closer scrutiny.

A Consumer Reports investigation revealed high lead levels in some bubble tea products in the US, echoing previous concerns about cassava-based foods. (No equivalent UK testing has been published.) The tapioca pearls – those signature "bubbles" – are made from cassava starch, and the root vegetable readily absorbs lead and other heavy metals from soil as it grows.

The tapioca pearls also pose other risks beyond contamination. Their starchy composition means that consuming large quantities can slow stomach emptying – a condition called gastroparesis – or, in some cases, lead to complete blockages.

Both can cause nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain, and symptoms can be particularly severe in people who already have slow-moving digestion.

Even guar gum – a thickener often added to bubble tea and harmless in small amounts – can lead to constipation if you drink it often.

The drink's composition also affects kidney health. In 2023, Taiwanese doctors removed over 300 kidney stones from a 20-year-old woman who'd been drinking bubble tea instead of water. Certain components, including oxalate and elevated phosphate levels, can contribute to stone formation. However, this extreme case probably reflects exceptionally high consumption.

For children, the risks are more immediate. The pearls can be a choking hazard – a risk that is well documented by paediatricians. Adults are not immune to this risk.

According to media reports in Singapore, a 19-year-old woman died after inhaling three pearls when sucking harder on a partially blocked straw, while another woman narrowly avoided the same fate thanks to fast-acting bystanders.

The sugar problem

The sugar content raises longer-term health concerns. Most bubble teas contain 20-50g of sugar, comparable to



or exceeding a can of Coca-Cola (35g). Research in Taiwan found that by age nine, children who regularly consumed bubble tea were 1.7 times more likely to have cavities in their permanent teeth. The same study linked lower consumption to reduced thoughts of suicide, though establishing causation remains complex.

Strange scans

There's even a curious medical phenomenon associated with consuming bubble tea: tapioca pearls appearing on scans of patients admitted for unrelated emergencies.

Doctors treating people after car accidents or with appendicitis have found dozens of pearls visible in stomachs and digestive tracts. These can occasionally cause diagnostic confusion, as they appear denser than the surrounding tissues and have stone-like properties similar to those seen with kidney- or gallstones.

This doesn't mean bubble tea should be banned, but it does suggest we treat it as an occasional indulgence instead of a daily habit. And if you do indulge, consider skipping a straw. Drinking directly from the cup gives you better control, and allows your mouth's sensory receptors to properly prepare for what's coming.

A HOME INSULATION FIASCO

HAS LEFT TENS OF THOUSANDS IN COLD AND LEAKY HOMES OVER WINTER

Britain's flagship home insulation programme has received a damning verdict from the National Audit Office. Under the Energy Company Obligation (ECO) scheme, tens of thousands of households have been left with faulty or even dangerous installations. It's a result, the auditors say, of weak oversight, poor skills and confused accountability.

This report is troubling not only because of the human cost but because it exposes a deeper failure of governance in how the UK tries to decarbonise home heating. It's a complex task that demands long-term stewardship, but is instead being left to the market.

The ECO was designed to make energy suppliers help households cut emissions and bills. Suppliers are the companies that buy electricity or gas from generators and sell it to you – the company named on your bills is your supplier.

In theory, the ECO means these suppliers meet government-set carbon or energy saving targets by funding insulation and heating upgrades for households, with regulators checking that installations qualify.

The ECO was preceded by two other schemes that operated on the same principle. For years, they worked reasonably well for simple and low-cost measures like loft or cavity wall insulation. But in 2013, the ECO was launched and expanded to cover more complex and expensive retrofits like solid wall insulation – an unprecedented shift.

So, what went wrong?

The National Audit Office's latest findings confirm fears that this was an approach set up to fail. Many installations require major remediation, some pose immediate health risks. The problems are familiar: an under-skilled workforce, uncertified installers, weak regulation and oversight.

Individually, these problems could be fixed. The government could improve installer training, tighten audits and crack down on fraud. But together, they reveal a deeper problem: a misplaced belief that market-based tools can deliver foundational change.



authorities, and it can often seem like no one is really in charge.

That's why the failings highlighted in the National Audit Office report are not just implementation glitches or down to some "bad apple" installers. They're failings of a governance model designed for incremental change, not the transformation required for net zero.

German lessons

If the UK really wants to retrofit millions of homes, it should look to what's worked in other countries. Germany's long-running KfW loan programme is one example. For more than three decades it has supported high-performance refurbishments through low-interest loans and grants. Successive German governments have recognised that the returns – in jobs, tax revenues, economic stimulus – have consistently outweighed the upfront cost.

By contrast, ECO has been repeatedly restructured, with shifting targets and funding levels that make it hard to plan ahead. Treating home retrofit as a short-term obligation rather than a long-term national project has left the UK far behind its peers.

Retrofitting homes is inherently local (you can't pick up your house and move it to a different area). Local authorities should therefore play a much stronger role in coordinating delivery, enforcing quality, and linking retrofit to other social goals such as tackling fuel poverty.

Getting councils involved would align retrofit with local priorities rather than distant central government targets. It could also rebuild trust among people who may understandably be wary of such schemes.

The UK's forthcoming warm homes plan is a chance to reset. The government should take a hard look at the tools at our disposal and think about what is needed to foster the creative and courageous policy needed to decarbonise our homes.




THE LIFE OF VIOLET: THREE UNEARTHED

EARLY STORIES WHERE VIRGINIA WOOLF'S GENIUS FIRST SPARKS TO LIFE

Few feelings are more thrilling for a literature scholar than unearthing an archival gem. Urmila Seshagiri, professor of English at the University of Tennessee, got to experience such a jolt when she was told about previously unseen typescripts of three short stories by Virginia Woolf.

of intergenerational exchange (Woolf was 20 and Dickinson 37 at their first meeting).

These were not merely society ties – their friendship ran deep: Dickinson cared for Woolf during a mental health crisis in 1904 at her home in Welwyn in Hertfordshire. Dickinson is also credited with enabling Woolf's early literary ambitions as she took steps toward her inimitable style.

In Friendships Gallery, we meet Violet as a child and follow her to middle age, although Woolf's narrator refuses to fill in the blanks that "yawn like awful caverns". Instead of facts, we find anecdotes woven into an elevated mediation on biography.

Woolf asks: "Where does care for others become care for oneself?" Individual care is extended collectively outwards, as Violet's bold laughter and antics slough off Victorian values. Through her friend's example, Woolf maps out a route towards independence for a new generation of women.

In The Magic Garden, Violet takes tea in an

aristocratic home, fielding information on gardening and plumbing. Such information fuels her quest for autonomy, as she cries out with joy about the benefits of having "a cottage of one's own". Such calls for creative independence pre-empt Woolf's later manifesto, *A Room of One's Own* (1929).

While the first two stories are anchored in an insider's perspective of English class dynamics, skewering prevailing social norms, the last, *A Story to Make You Sleep*, takes inspiration from Dickinson's visit to Japan and the letters she wrote to Woolf.

Turning from mock biography to ancient myth, the story follows a giant princess who saves a village through laughter, before riding a sea monster into an unknown destiny. Unmoored from a context Woolf knew, the use of made-up words and faux Japanese customs stand out – a point Seshagiri reflects on with nuance in the Afterword.

These fantastical, farcical, anti-fairy tales offer a glimpse into the early friendships that underpinned Woolf's world in the years after her parents passed away. They also hint at the playfulness to come in *Flush: A Biography* (1933) – a social commentary told from the perspective of poet Elizabeth Barrett Browning's cocker spaniel. They equally foreshadow the tale of queer love and time travel in *Orlando: A Biography* (1928), based on Woolf's relationship with the writer and gardener Vita Sackville-West.

Beyond Woolf's own canon of experimental biography, they also connect her to a tradition of surreal, feminist fabulists. In them, she finds odd kinship with the likes of Leonora Carrington and Angela Carter.

In bringing together these stories under the title *The Life of Violet*, the edition charts a literary turning point in the Woolf's life. The stories are filled with recurring subjects found in her writing: of women's history and education, of egalitarianism, of experimenting, and of blurring biographical fact with fiction.

They remind us that Woolf had a playful, sardonic side and used comedy, as much as highbrow literary experiments, to push beyond the boundaries of tradition. Discoveries such as this also show that the steady image of literary figures (especially those with a booming industry behind them) is never fixed – but rather, reshaped through new readers and ongoing interpretation.

As women's sport surges on the global stage, hosts England have lit up the Women's Rugby World Cup. But the tackles, speed and power fans see on the field are only part of the story. What we don't see is what it takes – both physically and psychologically – to wear England's emblem, the Red Rose.

The psychology of rugby shapes every performance. Behind the scenes lie early mornings, lonely and punishing rehab sessions, playing through pain, brutal setbacks, private doubts and personal sacrifices.

Before the whistle blows and the crowd roars, players stretch aching muscles, re-tape old injuries and mentally lock in. The changing room becomes a crucible – a place of intense pressure and transformation – where focus sharpens, rituals are repeated and the "game face" goes on.

That game face is more than a stare. It's the product of years of physical and psychological battles. It's the mindset that lets an athlete walk into the arena with purpose and conviction, no matter what pain or setbacks they've endured.

Consider Emily Scarratt, one of England's most celebrated players. In 2023 a surgeon advised her to retire after a complex neck injury threatened her career. Opting for an artificial disc replacement near her windpipe was risky – any operation that close to the airway and spinal cord carries the danger of nerve damage or breathing complications – and career-defining because the operation's success or failure would determine whether she could ever play again.

Her February 2024 return wasn't just about regaining fitness. It was also about showing the mental steel that "game face" represents, blocking out fear and doubt to perform at the sport's highest level. At 35, she became the first England player to feature in five Rugby World Cups.

Abi Burton's comeback is equally astonishing. Just three years ago she was diagnosed with autoimmune encephalitis – a rare condition in which the immune system attacks the brain, causing inflammation and severe neurological symptoms – and placed in a medically induced coma. She woke four weeks later unable to walk, talk, read or write and more than 19 kg lighter. After years of rehabilitation, she made her World Cup debut against Samoa in 2025.

Rosie Galligan's road back was just as brutal. She nearly lost her legs to meningitis in 2019, then fractured an ankle in early 2020, which sidelined her for over a year. Told by medical specialists and coaches



more than once that she might never play again, she fought back to the delayed 2022 World Cup and is now a standout player for 2025.

These headline comebacks highlight something the public rarely sees: the daily grind of resilience. Managing concussions and torn ligaments, coping with the psychological toll of repeated setbacks; just staying in the game takes an immense toll and can lead to player burnout without strong support. Ellie Kildunne, ruled out of the quarter-final with head-injury symptoms, has spoken openly about the mental strength needed to survive the toughest moments, calling the internal battles "the hardest to win".

So, while England may look clinical and composed on the pitch, every performance requires extraordinary emotional and mental strength. And the players are not doing it alone. Behind every recovery and every small gain is a network of coaches, physiotherapists, psychologists, doctors and support staff working to keep the foundations solid.

None of this happens by accident. It's the result of years of sustained investment in the women's game: not just in players, but in the infrastructure around them.

Since 2009, nearly £50 million in National Lottery funding has gone into girls' and women's rugby.

The Impact 25 legacy programme – World Rugby's initiative to grow the women's game before, during and long after the 2025 tournament – is injecting a further £12 million to expand grassroots pathways: community-level coaching, clubs and player-development routes that help girls progress from school or local teams into elite rugby across England and the home nations.

Elsewhere the contrast is stark. Teams such as Samoa have had to fundraise just to get players on the pitch: a sharp reminder of the global inequalities that persist in women's sport. While England can rotate two professional squads, other national teams are simply trying to cover basic costs.

England's story shows what's possible when talent is matched with belief and when belief is backed with resources and support.

England's success hasn't come easy: it's the product of years of grit, resilience and bold investment. If women's rugby is to grow globally, England's blueprint may be a powerful place to start.






